

## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Johnson , Iowa [19103]**

Johnson is one of 99 counties in Iowa. It is part of the [Iowa City, IA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2005 population of 117,194 ranked 5th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Johnson had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$34,556. This PCPI ranked 6th in the state and was 109 percent of the state average, \$31,670, and 100 percent of the national average, \$34,471. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.8 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 2.5 percent and the national change was 4.2 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Johnson was \$22,101 and ranked 7th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Johnson had a total personal income (TPI) of \$4,049,711\*. This TPI ranked 4th in the state and accounted for 4.3 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Johnson was \$2,309,305\* and ranked 5th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 4.5 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 2.9 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Johnson. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 74.5 percent of TPI (compared with 72.8 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.8 percent (compared with 19.6 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 8.7 percent (compared with 7.6 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 5.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.1 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 6.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Johnson increased from \$3,560,213\* in 2004 to \$3,739,215\* in 2005, an increase of 5.0 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 3.2 percent and the national change was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$2,017,011\* to the 2005 estimate was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
