

## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005 Winnebago , Iowa [19189]**

Winnebago is one of 99 counties in Iowa. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2005 population of 11,360 ranked 71st in the state.

### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Winnebago had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,028. This PCPI ranked 74th in the state and was 85 percent of the state average, \$31,670, and 78 percent of the national average, \$34,471. The 2005 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.6 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 2.5 percent and the national change was 4.2 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Winnebago was \$19,423 and ranked 43rd in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Winnebago had a total personal income (TPI) of \$307,036\*. This TPI ranked 72nd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Winnebago was \$229,269\* and ranked 65th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.7 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 2.9 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Winnebago. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 64.6 percent of TPI (compared with 62.4 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.3 percent (compared with 20.9 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.0 percent (compared with 16.7 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings decreased 2.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.0 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 3.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 0.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.3 percent.

### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Winnebago remained unchanged. The 2004-2005 state change was 3.2 percent and the national change was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$153,911\* to the 2005 estimate was 2.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
